Teamwork Awards recognize employees for their hard work, dedication and willingness to provide quality service and highlights the achievements of students attending the County's Vocational Schools.

Faatimah Jafiq is senior in the Illustration and Design Shop at the Bloomfield Tech Campus of the Essex County Vocational School System. Faatimah is a well-rounded student who excels in both her scholastic and extra-curricular activities. She has been an active member of the Future Business Leaders of America Club and the National Honor Society, where she heads up the annual food drive and has served as a tutor for underclass members. She also participated in the NJ Leap Program at Seton Hall University, which has prepared her for a future in a variety of professions.
